SPECIAL WORKSHOPS AND LEARNING LABS AT ASE 2020

ADULT CONGENITAL HEART DISEASE PRIMER*

This session is designed for adult sonographers and physicians with comprehensive lectures including approach to segmental anatomy, evaluation of intracardiac shunts, transposition of great arteries, congenital mitral and tricuspid anomalies, and aortic arch anomalies.

ADULT CONGENITAL HEART DISEASE: INTRODUCTION TO SCANNING PATIENTS: HANDS-ON*

This hands-on interactive workshop will be led by highly experienced ACHD sonographers and is geared towards providing learning opportunities for adult sonographers and physicians. The workshop will start with a brief presentation on protocol for scanning ACHD patients and technical tips and tricks to image congenital heart defects.
